Grant funding will be available on a 80/20 match basis for any qualified, neighborhood sponsored project/event(s). Matching funds may be in the form of cash, in-kind services such as donated supplies or equipment, and volunteer hours. Each neighborhood, with the exception of those legally recognized as part of a Public Improvement District, will be eligible to receive one (1) grant per fiscal year (October 1 – September 30) budget period. Each application will be reviewed by the Neighborhood Advisory Board and their recommendations will be forwarded to the City Council for consideration and final approval.*



Nominated Project – Night in White

What prompted your organization to develop this project/activity?

August 2020, the Fountains of Lake Ridge premiered our Cedar Hill Night in White. It was started by Allena Anderson. The purpose of this event was to allow families isolated in their homes as a result of COVID-19, an opportunity to socialize at a distance while also focusing on community. Everyone wore white and had mini parties in their driveways while being dressed in white, playing music, dancing and eating. This was a priority because typically our community would have hosted at least one community BBQ or get together. We could see that people needed to get out in a safe manner and socialize at a distance. Until this event, all interaction was just waving from afar.

6 Critical Steps

- 1. Identified the Problem.
- 2. Established a goal of having a safe event for 100% of the residents.
- 3. Developed safety parameters.
- 4. Established a date and time.
- 5. Sent out the flyer to residents.
- 6. Assign Roles. Neighbors had roles along the way which was hanging flyers, making phone calls, sending emails and making sure the word was communicated to everyone.

This project was successful because the resident were so excited to get dressed in all white and to mingle safely in our community. This was beneficial because the next morning residents were asking for the date of our next event.

- **2. Establish a vision and mission of the event that focuses on building community and fostering kindness within the neighborhood.**
- **3. Send out good advertisement with photos and examples so people can envision the event,**
- **4. Be flexible and include all neighbors (ask seniors if they need help and offer to set up or loan chairs/tables for those in need)**
