Citizens On Patrol Add Handicapped Parking Squad



The City of Cedar Hill has begun a new and innovative program to safeguard handicapped parking privileges within the City. Responding to increasing complaints from retailers and citizens reporting abuse of parking spaces reserved for handicap use, the Municipal Court and Police Department have joined together to target unlawful parking.

On April 19, Municipal Judge Michael Petty administered the Oath of Office to seven civilian members of the Cedar Hill Citizens On Patrol organization. Each of the seven members is a volunteer who serves without compensation, other than the personal pride and satisfaction of giving back to his/her community.

After the completion of a period of training and instruction provided by the Municipal Court and Police Department, the members will begin enforcing Texas laws on handicapped parking.

Equipped with digital cameras, police radios, and ticket books, the seven members of this pilot program will patrol designated handicapped parking areas.

Vehicles which do not display a valid handicap parking tag or license plate will be ticketed if found to be blocking, obstructing or occupying handicapped parking. The minimum fine is \$500 and can be as much as \$1,200.

New Side-load Trucks Bring Benefits



Waste Management's new residential trash collection process using automated auto-side load (ASL) trucks will begin on June 5.

The trucks coming to Cedar Hill will be brand new vehicles, powered by compressed natural gas (CNG) and emit substantially less hydrocarbons, and other pollutants, than their diesel counterparts.

The CNG powered trucks are also up to 50% quieter, more reliable, speedier and safer than the older trucks being taken out of service. Learn more at cedarhilltx.com/wm.
