Dear Residents and Visitors of Cedar Hill,
It is with great pleasure that I present the Cedar Hill Police Department 2018 Annual Report. Cedar Hill maintained a safe city crime index with a 30.81 per 1,000 population crime index rating.

Major accomplishments in 2018 include:

- 10% decrease in Crime Index rate
- 24% decrease in burglaries
- 36% decrease in robberies
- 90% overall customer rating for police services delivered based on a city wide customer service survey
- Achieved reaccreditation status for the third time from the Texas Police Chief's Best practices Program
- Implementation of new Axon Vehicle camera program
- 23% increase in Citizens on Patrol hours

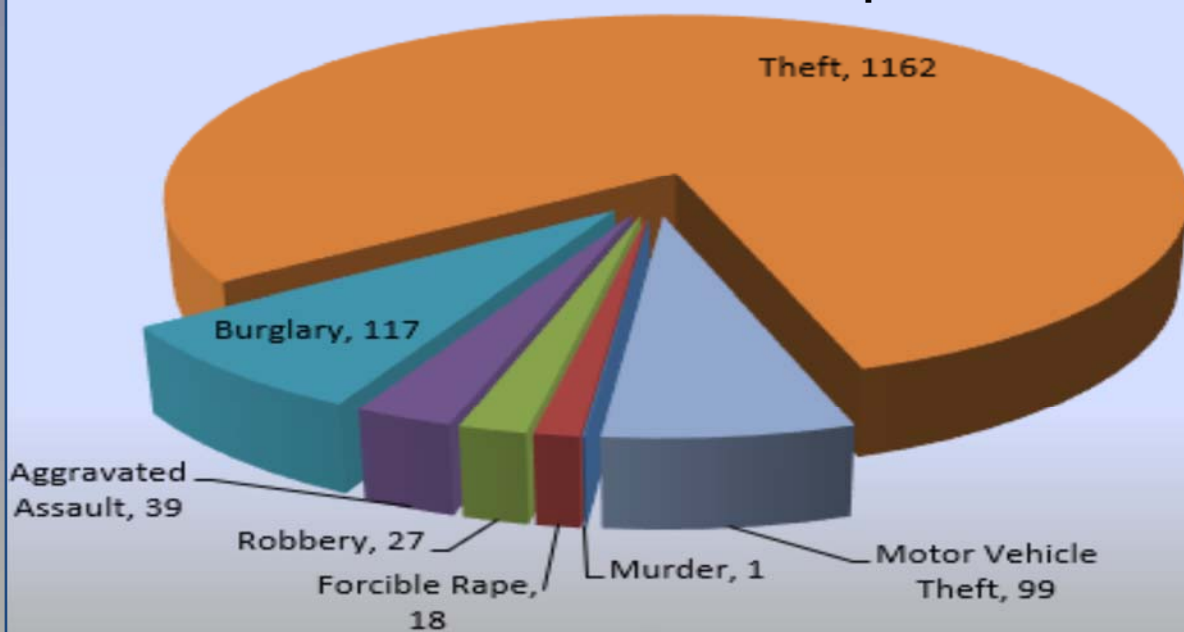

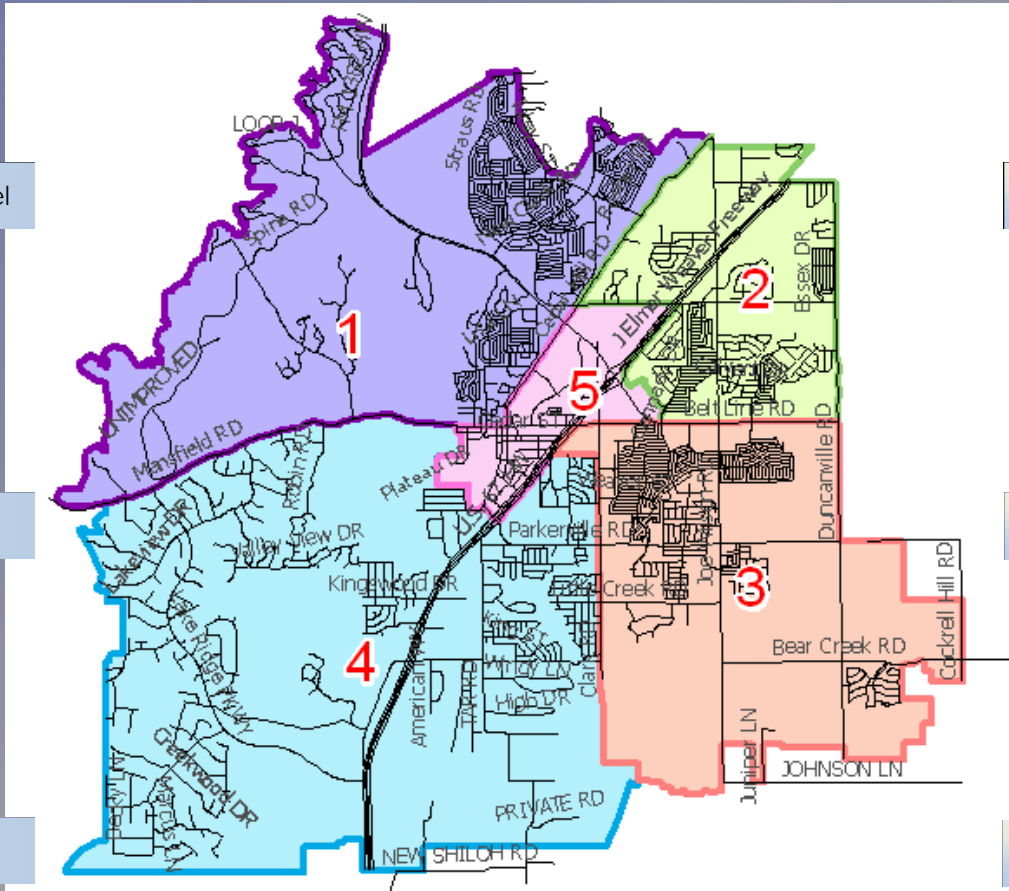

What is P.A.C.T.?

The Police and Community Team (P.A.C.T.) is a unit comprised of five officers and one sergeant who engage in crime prevention and problem solving activities in the community.

Each of the unit's officers is assigned to a patrol beat and works closely with other police department units to address issues. These officers also work closely with community groups and citizens to exchange information, provide crime prevention techniques, and resolve community crime concerns.

Mission Statement: The mission of the Cedar Hill Police Department is to provide the highest quality service that promotes and maintains a safe environment in partnership with the community consistent with our values.

In 2018, our citizen volunteers contributed 3,655.5 hours of their precious time to assist the police department in many areas. Additionally, the Citizens On Patrol program spent 6,154 hours and drove 9,208 miles patrolling the city to assist the police department in maintaining a safe environment. These dedicated community members gave freely of their time, which equaled a total labor value of \$246,218.

During 2018, the Handicap Parking Enforcement members of our Citizens On Patrol issued 172 violation notices in business parking lots.



During 2018, the P.A.C.T. Unit, in partnership with CHSD Police Department, hosted the 6th annual Youth Summit event, a free positive police/youth experience attended by 86 participants.
