



SITE CHOSEN FOR CEDAR HILL 'LIBRARY OF TOMORROW'

Voters approved funding in 2017 for a new public library facility that would meet current and future needs, providing for technological enhancements, flexible program space, and community meeting rooms that are not feasible in the existing structure. In July, the City announced the location of the new library building at Pioneer Trail and North Cedar Hill Road, near the Cedar Hill Government Center and the site of the future signature park.

The site was recommended by a citizen committee appointed by the city council to study options for future library locations. The location adjacent to the signature park provides opportunity to integrate nature and open space and additional amenities into the library project. The City will now engage a design team to complete the architectural and engineering plans for the building. Learn more about the project at letstalkcedarhill.com



Cedar Hill Fire Department hosted a teen fire academy this summer where participants learned about careers in emergency response.




Council Member Gregory Glover presented a proclamation to Steve Scott of Mission Cedar Hill for their work rehabilitating homes in Cedar Hill.

NOMINATIONS OPEN FOR NEIGHBORHOOD AWARDS

The City of Cedar Hill is now accepting nominations for the 2019 Love Your Neighborhood Awards for neighborhood organizations that have made a positive impact on our neighborhoods. This award recognizes neighborhoods for achievement in communication, organizational activities, community partnerships, leadership, and beautification.

The Neighborhood Award recipient receives a check in the amount of \$250 to be used for community building activities. A runner up will be selected and awarded \$100. This year's winners will be recognized at a workshop, part of the 2019 Neighborhood Summit, on Saturday, September 28, 2019, at the Government Center. BRADFORD PARK DEDICATED AT PARTY IN THE PARK

Neighbors enjoyed games, snacks, and music as improvements at Bradford Park in the High Pointe neighborhood were dedicated in July at Party in the Park. The project included replacement of the gazebo, wishing well, and pond fountain and was the third park reinvestment project funded through the bond program that was approved by voters in 2017.



Public Input Underway for 2020 Park Improvements

In November 2017, Cedar Hill voters approved \$15 million for parks improvements, including funding for reinvestment in neighborhood and community parks. Improvements have been completed at Bradford Park, Calf Pasture Park, and Virginia Weaver Park. 2020 projects will include Kingswood Park, Liberty Park, and Longhorn Park.

Online surveys and public input meetings were held in June and July for Kingswood and Liberty Parks. A public meeting is scheduled for Longhorn Park on August 29 from 6 to 8 p.m. at the Alan E.
