FY2020 BUDGET FOCUSED ON SAFETY, NEIGHBORHOODS

The City Council will take action in September on the proposed Fiscal Year 2019-2020 budget, which includes a recommendation to maintain the current property tax rate of \$0.697028 for the eighth year in a row.

The budget advances the City Council's vision of a premier city that retains its distinctive character, where families and businesses flourish in a safe and clean environment. Proposals address the top priorities of the community including: investing in public safety, continuing to aggressively implement the bond program approved by voters in 2017, and enhancing neighborhood integrity and engagement.

FY2020 Budget Highlights

- 65% of General Fund expenditures are dedicated to public safety services, including 81% of all new revenue.
- An additional code enforcement officer and customer service support for code complaints are funded.
- An ambulance and other public safety equipment will be replaced.
- Budget includes traffic safety and speed monitoring equipment for neighborhoods.
- Bond projects funded in 2019-2020 include neighborhood park improvements; design of the new public library, signature park, and outdoor pool; street repairs and improvements; renovation of the senior center.

How Do We Compare?

The City of Cedar Hill has consistently maintained a lower tax rate than surrounding cities, behind the City of Grand Prairie, which has a larger population and almost four times the taxable value of Cedar Hill. In 2017, Cedar Hill was ranked among the leanest local governments in North Texas by the Dallas Business Journal, which analyzed the number of government employees relative to cities' populations. The City Council's lean approach and stable tax rate policy is one reason the City of Cedar Hill has one of the lowest property tax rates in the area.



PETCO FOUNDATION INVESTS \$200K IN SURGERY SUITE

The Petco Foundation has awarded \$200,000 to Tri-City Animal Shelter and its non-profit partner, Friends of Tri-City Animal Shelter.

The Petco Foundation's investment will be utilized to help renovate the shelter's old building, located on the current animal shelter's campus, into a surgery suite and medical center. This new facility will be used to provide veterinary care to over 7,000 animals at Tri-City Animal Shelter each year.



"Four years ago, we began to recognize the shelter's lack of capacity for treating injury and illness," said Corey Thompson, Friends of Tri-City Animal Shelter Executive Director. "If they transported every stray animal that needed veterinary care to one of the local vets, they would do nothing else all day — not to mention the financial constraints."

"The shelter team told us they could save more animals if they could bring veterinary care in-house, so there was no question that our non-profit was going to commit to making that happen," said Thompson. Friends of Tri-City Animal Shelter launched a \$500,000 capital campaign in September 2018 and hopes to open the new facility in 2020.

"We're so thankful that the Petco Foundation shares our commitment to lifesaving and has chosen to partner with us to build the Surgery Suite and Medical Center," said shelter manager Tammy Miller. "We asked for help and they came through in such an incredible way for us."

"We're happy to support Tri-City Animal Shelter's lifesaving work which is creating a better world for pets and the people who care for them," said Susanne Kogut, president of the Petco Foundation.
