Many of our neighbors and friends face challenges in the wake of the coronavirus pandemic. Here are some ways you can help your community during a difficult time.

Check on your neighbor. Social distancing doesn't have to mean isolation. Call, text, or write a note to check on your neighbor, especially if they are an older adult. Your neighbor may have trouble getting groceries, medication, and other necessities. Ask how you can help and don't hesitate to ask for help yourself.

Donate to Community Organizations. The Cedar Hill Shares Food Pantry helps feed our neighbors in need within the 75104 zip code and Cedar Hill Independent School District boundaries. Visit cedarhillshares.org to make a donation.

PROGRESS CONTINUES ON PARKS BOND PROJECTS

Construction continues on schedule for four Parks bond projects that were planned for 2020: Senior Center Improvements, Kingswood Park, Liberty Park, and Longhorn Park.

The Senior Center improvements have been substantially completed, including HVAC upgrades, new paint, kitchen updates, and other cosmetic improvements.



Exercise stations and new playground equipment are being installed at Kingswood Park. This project also included extension of a walking trail, repairs of an existing retaining wall, and landscaping enhancements.



A new playground is under construction at Longhorn Park. New solar trail lights have been installed at Liberty Park. A new playground is planned for construction in May.
