DANIELS, MCCURDY SWORN IN FOR CITY COUNCIL PLACES 1, 4

Council members Shirley Daniels and Chad A. McCurdy were sworn in to places 1 and 4 on May 11, 2021. Daniels and McCurdy were re-elected to their positions in the May 1, 2021 general city council election.

The City of Cedar Hill is a home rule city with a council-manager form of government. The council members in this form of government are the leaders and policy-makers elected to represent various segments of the community and concentrate on policy issues that are responsive to citizens' needs and wishes.

As a legislative body, the council members are the community decision-makers. They approve the budget and determine the tax rate. The city council focuses on community goals, major projects, and long-term considerations such as community growth, land-use development, capital improvement plans, capital financing, and strategic planning.

The Cedar Hill City Council generally meets on the second and fourth Tuesdays of the month at the Cedar Hill Government Center located at 285 Uptown Blvd. Agendas are available 72 hours in advance of the meetings at cedarhilltx.com/agenda.

TAKE CONTROL OF YOUR UTILITY BILL IN 3 EASY STEPS

As summer heats up, demand for water increases. Through the Cedar Hill Watersmart customer portal, users can monitor consumption, set up text or email alerts, and pay bills online. Start saving water and money with these three easy steps!

Step 1: Register or Log in to the Customer Portal

Visit cedarhilltx.watersmart.com to set up and log in to the customer portal. Registration is simple and gives users access to the full array of tools, including usage history. Customers can still pay utility bills without registering or logging in by clicking 'Pay My Bill'.

Step 2: Get Consumption Data & Set Thresholds

After registering or logging in, the home screen shows water consumption data for the account. The data can be viewed by monthly, daily, or hourly use, and can be downloaded for further analysis.

Step 3: Get Email or Text Alerts About Your Usage

Choose thresholds for your water use to set a trigger for warnings and alerts. Once the threshold limit is set, you can request automatic messages by email or text when usage exceeds the threshold or the system detects a leak.

REGISTER YOUR LOVED ONE FOR THE H.O.M.E. PROGRAM

The Cedar Hill Police Department's H.O.M.E. program helps first responders identify children or adults who are unable to communicate their names or addresses due to a cognitive impairment.
