## HILLWOOD BREAKS GROUND ON LOGISTICS CENTER

On August 11, the Cedar Hill City Council, Economic Development Corporation, and Hillwood Development broke ground on High Point 67, a landmark industrial development. The project, located on S. US-67 south of Mount Lebanon Road, will be a Class A logistics and manufacturing center with up to two million square feet on more than 180 acres. The project is expected to generate more than \$75 million in capital investment, \$100 million in new taxable value, and support the creation of hundreds of jobs in Cedar Hill.

Hillwood, founded by Ross Perot, Jr., is ranked as one of the top industrial, commercial, and residential real estate developers in the country. The company's founding project, AllianceTexas, has been hailed as one of the best mixed-use developments in the world.

The project's location provides excellent highway visibility and access, proximity to an abundant workforce, and easy connectivity to the region.
