KNOW WHAT TO DO: BE READY FOR WINTER WEATHER

Texas weather is unpredictable. Sunny days can quickly give way to bitter cold and severe weather. Remember the four “Ps” to be prepared and stay safe in the cold weather this winter:

People: Keep your family warm and stay inside if possible. Dress in layers and wear hats, gloves, and a coat. Check on elderly family members and neighbors who may need extra blankets or a warm place to stay.

Pets: Bring pets inside and move livestock and other animals to a sheltered area. Make sure pets have adequate food and water available.

Plants: Bring potted plants inside, store in garage, or cover with cloth fabric to protect them from wind and frost.

Pipes: Disconnect outdoor hoses, drain, and store in a protected area. Wrap exposed faucets and pipes, including those outside the house or in unheated crawl spaces, attics, garages, and other areas.

HIGH POINTE, SLEEPY HOLLOW RECOGNIZED AS PREMIER NEIGHBORHOODS

2021 marks the 17th year that the Neighborhood Advisory Board will recognize neighborhood organizations in the City of Cedar Hill for their work towards improving the quality of life in their communities. Two stood out this year as Premier Neighborhoods: High Pointe and Sleepy Hollow.

The High Pointe HOA is a diverse community composed of more than 2500 homes with lush lawns and beautiful landscaping. The HOA conducted two food drives in November and December 2020, collecting turkeys, chickens, canned goods, and a \$200 donation for the Cedar Hill Food Pantry. The neighborhood is active in their High Pointe Community Garden and has also been featured in the Southwest Now Magazine.



The Sleepy Hollow neighborhood association was formed in 2021 in an effort to maintain, improve and unify the community surrounding the vicinity. They are organizing neighborhood cleanups and welcome kits for new residents.
