CONSTRUCTION KICKS OFF FOR NEW OUTDOOR POOL

This month the City kicked off construction of the new community pool, the Lagoon at Virginia Weaver Park, with a Luau-themed celebration. The community enjoyed free food, games, and live music as the City Council, Parks and Recreation Board, and Community Development Corporation Board broke ground on the project.

The new pool is expected to open in Summer 2023 and will feature almost 10,000 square feet of water surface, including a zero-depth entry pool, a separate lap swim pool, a lazy river and three-turn slide, and a splash feature.

Voters approved funding for the project in 2017. In 2018, the City began the design process for the pool, which included site analysis and selection. The site analysis assesses environmental conditions, potential impacts to existing programs and amenities, and other site-specific considerations. Based on this analysis and input from the City Council, Parks Board, and citizens, Virginia Weaver Park was selected as the location for the new pool.

The City received a grant from Texas Parks and Wildlife for \$750,000 towards the construction cost. The pool was designed after broad public input from the community, which drove the selection of amenities.

CONSERVE WATER, SAVE MONEY IN 3 EASY STEPS

As summer heats up, demand for water increases. Through the Cedar Hill Watersmart customer portal, users can monitor consumption, set up text or email alerts, and pay bills online. Start saving water and money with these three easy steps!

Step 1: Register or Log in to the Customer Portal

Visit cedarhilltx.watersmart.com to set up and log in to the customer portal. Registration is simple and gives users access to the full array of tools, including usage history. Customers can still pay utility bills without registering or logging in by clicking 'Pay My Bill'.

Step 2: Get Consumption Data & Set Thresholds

After registering or logging in, the home screen shows water consumption data for the account. The data can be viewed by monthly, daily, or hourly use, and can be downloaded for further analysis.

Step 3: Get Email or Text Alerts About Your Usage

Choose thresholds for your water use to set a trigger for warnings and alerts. Once the threshold limit is set, you can request automatic messages by email or text when usage exceeds the threshold or the system detects a leak.
