"The more involvement we have from our community, the safer we'll be," said Police Chief Ely Reyes, whose top goal is to make Cedar Hill one of the safest places to live in North Texas. JAXSON STROUD, TIM LYONS RECEIVE LIFESAVING AWARD

Cedar Hill residents Jaxson Stroud and Tim Lyons received a Lifesaving Award last month for their heroic actions in a house fire in July 2022.

On July 28, 2022, nine-year-old Jaxson was visiting his wheelchair-bound grandmother when he heard an explosion on the backyard patio. After noticing smoke and flames entering the house, Jaxson quickly jumped into action and assisted his grandmother into her wheelchair and began pushing her to safety. As he yelled for help, his neighbor, Tim Lyons entered the house to assist him and Mrs. Stroud to escape the intense heat and smoke from the blazing fire that severely damaged their house. Both Jaxson and Mr. Lyons risked their own safety to rescue another and displayed a distinct and unselfish heroic character.




