



CEDAR HILL HIGHLIGHTS

WELCOME TO CEDAR HILL, PRATT INDUSTRIES!

Last month the City Council and Economic Development Corporation officially cut the ribbon to welcome Pratt Industries' Regional Manufacturing and Innovation Center at the new High Point 67 industrial campus developed by Hillwood.

At capacity, the 1.1 million square foot plant – one of the largest and most modern of the company's 71 facilities spread across 25 US states – will provide 375 full-time, high-paying, green-collar manufacturing jobs.

The Cedar Hill site will produce retail specialty products as well as corrugated boxes and in-store displays for some of America's leading companies using the company's signature 100% recycled containerboard, consistent with Cedar Hill's culture of conservation and sustainability.

In addition to bringing new jobs to Cedar Hill, Pratt will also sponsor a training and development program in collaboration with the city and school district.



Pratt Industries is America's 5th largest corrugated packaging company and the world's largest, privately-held 100% recycled paper and packaging company. Pratt was founded in the U.S. more than 35 years ago and operates manufacturing facilities in more than 25 states.




Resident Oseas Perez won a \$100 Gift Card for participating in the City's branding survey in October.

BE PREPARED FOR WINTER WEATHER!

Texas weather is unpredictable. Sunny days can quickly give way to bitter cold and severe weather. Remember the four "Ps" to be prepared and stay safe in the cold.

PEOPLE - Keep your family warm and stay inside if possible. Dress in layers and wear hats, gloves, and a coat. Check on elderly family members and neighbors who may need extra blankets or a warm place to stay.

PETS - Bring pets inside and move livestock and other animals to a sheltered area. Make sure pets have adequate food and water available.

PLANTS - Bring potted plants inside, store in garage, or cover with cloth fabric to protect them from wind and frost.

PIPES - Disconnect outdoor hoses, drain, and store in a protected area. Wrap exposed faucets and pipes, including those outside the house or in unheated crawl spaces, attics, garages, and other areas.

NEW LIBRARY, PARK ON TRACK FOR GRAND OPENING IN SPRING 2024

Progress continues on the new Library, Museum, and Signature Park located on Pioneer Trail near the Cedar Hill Government Center. In November, the contractor reached 77% completion on the building and 50% completion of the park and trail.

The project team is on track for a spring opening of the facility, and the original site selection and design committees have been re-engaged to begin planning for the opening celebrations.
