RICHARD DAVIS SWORN IN AS NEW FIRE CHIEF FOR CITY OF CEDAR HILL

Richard L. Davis, Jr. was appointed as Chief of the Cedar Hill Fire Department. Davis previously served as the Assistant Fire Chief of the Austin Fire Department, where he has served in numerous capacities for more than 30 years.

"I am honored to be your next fire chief. It is my privilege to work with an outstanding team of dedicated individuals from the Cedar Hill Fire Department whose values of respect, integrity, courage, and honor are part of everything they do. Throughout his career in the Austin Fire Department, Davis has served in many facets of fire, including Medical Operations, Fire Operations, Wellness, Fire Prevention, Investigations, Wildfire, Recruiting, Human Resources, Community Outreach, and overseeing the Fire Cadet Training Academy.

Davis holds a Master of Science in Executive Fire Service Leadership, a Bachelor of Science in Management/Marketing, and an Associate of Science in Logistics Management.

He is also a graduate of the National Fire Academy's Executive Fire Officers Program. Davis is an eight-year United States Air Force veteran who served during the Gulf War in support of Desert Storm and Desert Shield; he continues wearing two uniforms, serving his country as a military reservist, and being a fire department member.

Davis began his duties as Fire Chief on January 16.



CEDAR HILL NAMED AIR NORTH TEXAS 'PARTNER OF THE YEAR'

Air North Texas recently named Cedar Hill its Partner of the Year in recognition of the city's efforts to improve air quality throughout ozone season.

Cedar Hill was recognized for initiatives such as providing sustainability grants in the Green Awards, birding backpacks available for free checkout at the local library, and website and social media content.

Cedar Hill worked throughout the year to increase community involvement, hosting over 25 events including Earth Fest, an annual signature event in April dedicated to air quality and environmental sustainability. The city also established the Beautification and Environmental Sustainability Board to provide support to sustainability projects and a clean air initiative. Further illustrating its commitment to a future of clean air, the city is developing environmental education workshops.

Air North Texas is a regional public awareness campaign that includes 38 partners pursuing environmental awareness in North Texas. It was formed by the North Central Texas Council of Governments with support of the Air North Texas Coalition. Partners support the campaign by encouraging residents to commit to actions that improve air quality, such as working from home, bicycling, or walking to the store and packing a lunch.

Each year, partner governments across the region submit progress reports based on criteria in the Air North Texas Partner Agreement to be judged for their efforts in helping to promote better air quality in North Texas.

Air North Texas is one of many strategies to improve air quality in the region, calling on individuals and employers to adopt simple changes that can be incorporated into their daily routines to reduce emissions and create cleaner air.

Ozone season in North Texas lasts from March through November, but residents, businesses and governments are encouraged to contribute to the effort to improve the air throughout the year.




