## CEDAR HILL POLICE DEPARTMENT CELEBRATES 50 YEARS OF SERVICE

Cedar Hill Police Department is hitting a big milestone - it's turning 50 this year! They're not just letting the occasion slide, though. Nope, they're digging deep into their past and bringing out some cool stuff. The police folks are getting special badges that are like throwbacks to the first-ever police chief, Chief Marshall Crow.

In a nostalgic nod to the past, officers will be seen sporting these badges throughout the year. These badges aren't just decorative, they're symbols of the department's longstanding commitment to the community. Officials say they serve as a reminder of the foundation laid by those who came before and the enduring values that continue to guide law enforcement's efforts today.

As the CHPD honors its golden anniversary, it pays homage to the legacy of Chief Marshall Crow and the evolution of the department over five decades of policing. Police departments across the nation often mark significant

anniversaries with similar gestures, commemorating the milestones that shape their identities and cultures.

The CHPD's decision to celebrate its golden jubilee with a tangible piece of history is a move that grounds the present force in a sense of a shared past – while continuing to look forward to the future. It's a commemoration of service that both acknowledges the history of the badge and the continued commitment required to wear it.





# SPRING CLEANING: KNOW WHAT TO THROW!

Are you tackling spring cleaning this month? Follow these guidelines to properly dispose of bulky trash, brush and leaves, and household hazardous waste.

**Bulk items and brush** are collected together in one pile once per month at the curb (even if you have an alley) and are limited to 10 cubic yards.

**Acceptable bulk items include:** appliances, furniture, fence sections, bags of leaves or other residential items too large for a container. Refrigerators, freezers, window A/C units, and similar items must be tagged as “free of freon”. Toilets must be drained. **Bulk items do not include:** construction debris; hazardous waste; vehicles parts, tires, televisions or electronics.

Bulk items and brush must be placed at the curb by **7 a.m. on the Monday morning of your collection week**. Waste Management may collect your items any day of the scheduled week. Refer to the Collection Schedule & Map to determine your set-out day and collection week, which are color coded below for each month.

Residents can schedule home pick up for unwanted **household hazardous waste** materials through Waste Management’s At Your Door Special Collection<sup>SM</sup>. Fertilizers, insect sprays, herbicides, pesticides & weed killers

## Household Chemicals

Ammonia, heavy-duty cleansers, shower/tile cleaners, drain cleaners



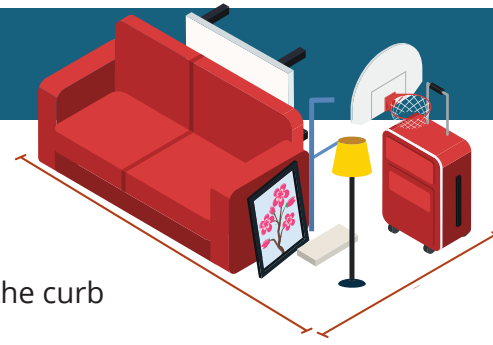
## Electronics

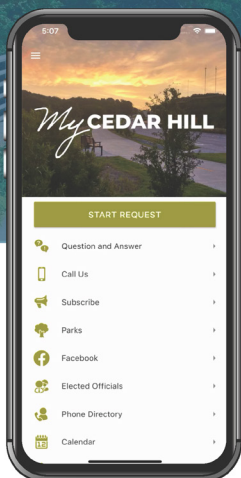
