



CEDAR HILL HIGHLIGHTS

PROPOSED BUDGET MAINTAINS CITY SERVICES, REDUCES PROPERTY TAX RATE

This month the Cedar Hill City Council will consider the proposed budget for the 2024-2025 fiscal year. The proposed budget maintains the services, infrastructure, and amenities that are the foundation to everyday life in Cedar Hill. The budget also reduces the property tax rate by one cent to \$0.63 per \$100 assessed value, or about \$5 per day for the average Cedar Hill single-family home.

The budget also advances the City Council's strategic priorities: Public Safety; Bond Implementation; Planning & Development; Communications; and Community Engagement and Neighborhood Revitalization.

These priorities are the result of extensive and on-going community engagement as expressed through Cedar Hill's integrated network of strategic plans, community surveys, neighborhood walks, and citizen committees.

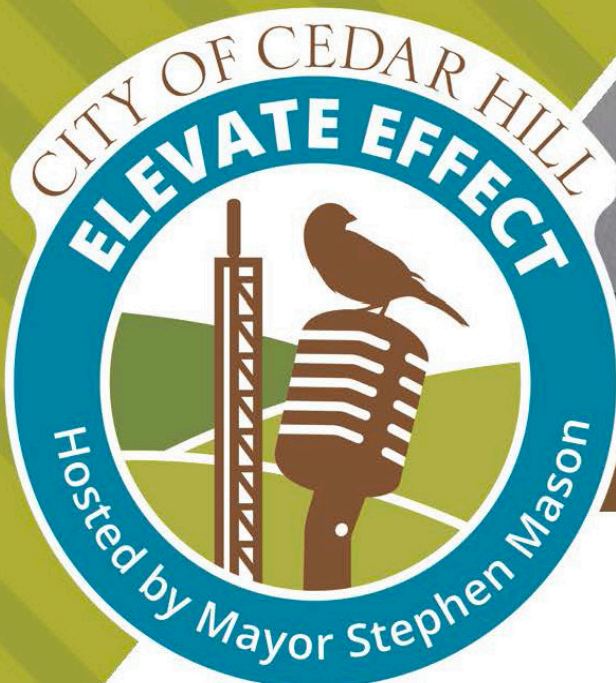
