GROW WILD, MOW LESS: SUPPORTING POLLINATORS IN CEDAR HILL

During the summer months, mowing becomes a common routine, but not all areas need frequent trimming. Cedar Hill Parks & Recreation recently released a lighthearted and educational video featuring wildflowers, pollinators, and even a surprise visit from Sasquatch to emphasize the importance of preserving pollinator habitats.

The video, which first debuted on the Parks and Recreation social media page, encourages residents and visitors to support the city's sustainability efforts by allowing designated areas to grow naturally. By mowing less in certain parklands and green spaces, we help protect native wildflowers and the pollinators—like bees and butterflies—that depend on them.

This initiative aligns with Cedar Hill's continued commitment to environmental stewardship and the conservation of local ecosystems. Residents are invited to "grow wild, mow less," and take part in supporting the health and diversity of pollinator populations across the city.
