### CEDAR HILL LAUNCHES GOATSCAPING INITIATIVE TO SUPPORT SUSTAINABLE HABITAT MANAGEMENT


When it comes to habitat management, the City of Cedar Hill has hired the greatest of all time (or as it's better known, the G.O.A.T.) – quite literally. In partnership with North Texas-based Open Space Development, the City has welcomed a hardworking crew of goats to help restore balance to a local nature preserve. These four-legged landscapers are taking on overgrown vegetation one bite at a time, proving that sustainability can be both effective and charming.

This innovative approach, known as goatscaping, reflects Cedar Hill's commitment to environmentally friendly land management. Instead of relying on machinery or chemicals, the goats use controlled grazing

to clear vegetation, fertilize the soil, and support the recovery of native plants. The herd is targeting invasive species such as *Ligustrum sinense* (Chinese privet) and *Sorghum halepense* (Johnson grass), which threaten native ecosystems. By grazing on these plants, the goats help restore the natural balance that supports pollinators, birds, and other wildlife.

"Goatscaping is a simple yet powerful tool for habitat management," said Shawn Ray, Parks and Recreation Director for the City of Cedar Hill. This natural solution also reduces emissions, minimizes soil erosion, and eliminates the need for herbicides. Sometimes the best way to care for the environment is to let nature do the work.

Happy 21st Anniversary to the Alan E. Sims Recreation Center! Thank you to all who were able to attend and join in on the fun.




