# Wind working with solar

"In Cedar Hill we are blessed with a beautiful natural environment", Mayor Rob Franke recently said, "Our 'Growing Green' initiative is our decision to be intentional, to learn about new technologies, conservation, reuse and preservation."

He said a primary goal of the City's Growing Green initiative is to maintain the distinctive char-

acter and wholesome lifestyle of our community while being responsible stewards of our gift.

The recent addition of a 4.5 kW wind turbine system at the Government Center is the latest example of Growing Green in action.

This wind energy project joins solar panels on the roof, electric vehicles and chargers in the parking lot and

enhanced recycling services city-wide.

"The wind turbine does many things," says Melissa Stephens, Assistant City Manager. "First and foremost it serves as a symbol of the City's dedication to

**Now apartment renters can recycle too! Apartment managers are offering recycling services in cooperation with the City and Waste Management.**

green technology and renewable energy.

At the Government Center residents and visitors can view and experience several forms of renewable energy including solar, wind, electric vehicles and electric vehicle charging stations."

### Part of the plan

Stephens said renewable energy projects are not undertaken unless they make sense in three categories: socially (the community), environmentally (carbon emission reduction) and economically (saving the City money or is a grant-funded project).

The City Council adopted a Sustainability Action plan that expresses the desire to offset the costs of electricity with renewable energy. Staff has used that guide in pursuing federal and state grants for projects.

The wind turbine may look more like public art than a generator, but it is a real tool in the City's plan to explore viable renewable energy options. The screen at left, located in the lobby of the Government Center, shows visitors real-time generation of electricity by the wind turbine and solar panels on the roof.



## Watering restrictions

**No watering between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. seven days a week from May 1 to Sept. 30**

From May 1 to September 30, outdoor watering is prohibited between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. Fines for violators start at \$200 for the first offense.

The City requests no outside watering at all on Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays to allow the system to re-

plenish supplies in the water storage tanks.

# Local items on November 6 ballot

During the August 14 City Council meeting, two ordinances were approved to add propositions to the November 6 ballot.

## Crime Control and Prevention District

The City is asking voters to approve the creation of the Crime Control and Prevention District. This citywide crime prevention initiative is to fund police officers to keep Cedar Hill safe with no new taxes.

It involves reallocating 1/8 of 1 cent from the existing revenues of the Economic Development Corporation to fund this program. Approval is for five years.

## Legal sale of beer and wine

The second proposition allows voters to decide whether Cedar Hill will be authorized to approve the legal sale of beer and wine for off premise consumption only.

This proposition was brought to the City Council with a petition containing a number of signatures totaling more than 35% of the registered voters in the City who voted in the most recent gubernatorial election. The petition was certified by the City Secretary as required by the Texas Election Code.

## CHISD bond election

Also of local interest on the November 6 ballot is a bond election proposal of \$45 million to address district-wide safety and security, HVAC and roof replacements, technology infrastructure and equipment upgrades.


